The Liturgy of the Word

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

FIRST READING

Exodus 3:1-8.14-15

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law, priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There an angel of Yahweh appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. `I must look at this strange sight.' Moses said `and see why the bush is not burnt.' Now Yahweh saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush. `Moses. Moses!' he said. `Here I am' he answered. `Come no nearer' he said, `Take off your shoes for the place on which you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your father, he said 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God. And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them up out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land where milk and honey flow. Then Moses said to God, `I am to go, then, to the sons of Israel and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you". But if they ask me what his name is, what am I to tell them?' And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am. This' he added 'is what you must say to the sons of Israel: "I Am has sent me to you".' And God also said to Moses, 'You are to say to the sons of Israel: "Yahweh, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you". This is my name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.

SECOND READING

Corinthians 10:1-6.10-12

I want to remind you, how our fathers were all guided by a cloud above them and how they all passed through the sea. They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea; all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ.

In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert. These things all happened as warnings for us, not to have the wicked lusts for forbidden things that they had. You must never complain: some of them did, and they were killed by the Destroyer. All this happened to them as a warning, and it was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age. The man who thinks he is safe must be careful that he does not fall

He told this parable: `A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. He said to the man who looked after the vineyard, "Look here, for three years now I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and finding none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir," the man replied, "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down."

FATHER DAT'S PILGRIM BLOG (Week 3)

When in Rome, do as the Romans do! Our first Holy Door was at St Peter's Basilica touching it with prayer. Our second Holy Door was at St Paul's Basilica, praying the Stations of the Cross between St Paul's statue and the tomb.

Moving outside of Rome, we travelled towards the mountainous Cinque Terre, and transited through Florence, a city of pagan artwork and sculptures, finding understanding and comfort from St Paul's letters to the Romans.

Riomaggiore was our first stop at Cinque Terre. I concelebrated, in Italian, Mass at St John the Baptist church, highlighting the universal church. With this blessing we continued to Manarola, Vernazza, Corniglia and Monterosso. Returning to Rome, we visited Pisa, our first sight was the Baptismal Chapel, then the leaning bell tower, and finally the cathedral. We recalled and prayed for our parish RCIA members.

Our final two Holy Doors were at St John Lateran and St Mary Major. At the Basilica of St John Lateran we reflected on the artwork and the statues of the Apostles. At St Mary Major Basilica, there were confessions and time for adoration. We prayed the rosary in the chapel of St Mary Major for the intentions of the parish.

Given we still have a few days left, pilgrims were asked to reflect on positive changes they have experienced. The spirit led us to common realisation that spiritual journey can provide opportunities to re-discover prayer, experience the universal church, bringing alive sacred scriptures, being part of a group, and encountering other pilgrims. As pilgrims we look forward to continuing our strong spiritual journey. Godspeed.




3RD SUNDAY OF LENT
